

INFORMATION ON CONTINUING TRAINING FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2025/2026 ESTONIAN ENTREPRENEURSHIP UNIVERSITY OF APPLIED SCIENCES

1. Fundamentals of organisation of studies

The training courses are open for all interested persons whose ability to complete the training is beyond the reasonable doubts of the AS Eesti Ettevõtluskõrgkoolil Mainor/Estonian Entrepreneurship University of Applied Sciences (hereinafter referred to as EEK Mainor). A trainee will be excluded from the training course if they express their wish to leave or if it is apparent to the trainer that the person is not able to complete the course (or parts of it that are yet to be completed) as well as after successful completion of the course.

As a rule, continuing training is subject to a fee (except for training funded by the Estonian Unemployment Insurance Fund or other ESF programmes). The Board of EEK Mainor decides on the organisation of free training courses or tuition fee waivers. As a rule, the training fee is paid in advance and is non-refundable. The exact arrangements for the payment of tuition fees will be decided and communicated to the trainees on the basis of each course.

2. Bases for quality assurance

The organisation of training is based on a clearly identified societal or economic need to provide such training. The basis for identifying the need may be:

- public procurement order (procurement);
- supportive reception of initial concept sales by partners (market validation);
- compliance of the content of the training with the priority outlined in the national development plans (social mission).

The curricula, the recruitment of trainers and the quality of the learning environment follow the same best practices as EEK Mainor in terms of designing curricula, recruiting lecturers and ensuring a high-quality learning environment. EEK Mainor's processes have been recognised by the International Evaluation Commission in the framework of the institutional accreditation in 2021. Feedback on the trainings is collected at the end of the training through a voluntary questionnaire survey.
